“Each of us hears them speaking in our own tongue about the marvels that God has accomplished.”

Salesian Perspective

Despite the fact that they were speaking to many people from many languages and many cultures, the apostles were understood by all of their listeners as they proclaimed the marvels that God had accomplished.

How was this possible?

Enflamed by the power of the Holy Spirit, the apostles were speaking the language of the heart. They were speaking with enthusiasm. They were speaking with gratitude. They were speaking with praise and thanksgiving. They were speaking from their core. They were speaking from their soul.

In short, they were speaking the universal language - the language of the heart.

We are most human - we are most divine - when we speak the language of the heart, when we speak the language of love, when we speak and listen from the soul, when we are grounded in the Word-Made-Flesh.

As we know all too well from our own experience, there is more to communication than meets the eye...for that matter, even the tongue or the ear. Communicating is often a lot easier said than done. We frequently misunderstand one another. We frequently presume to know what others are thinking or feeling. We frequently use the same words for which there are different meanings. We frequently have different ways of saying the same thing. We frequently hear, but we frequently fail to listen. We are always talking, but talking is not the same as communicating.....of speaking from one heart to another.

St. Francis de Sales tells us that the Holy Spirit comes to inflame the hearts of believers. When we speak and listen from hearts enflamed with joy, truth and gratitude, conflict gives way to understanding, confusion gives way to clarity, estrangement gives way to intimacy, hurt gives way to healing, frustration gives way to forgiveness, violence gives way to peace, sin gives way to salvation.

Francis de Sales offers us this advice: “Speak always

of God as God, that is, reverently and devoutly, not with ostentation or affectation, but with a spirit of meekness, charity, and humility. Distill as much as you can of the delicious honey of devotion and of divine things imperceptibly into the ears of now one person and then of another. Pray to God in your soul that it may please God to make this holy dew sink deep into the hearts of those who hear you. It is wonderful how powerfully a sweet and amiable proposal of good things attracts to hearts of hearers.”

How might we need to speak, to listen to, to practice the language of love today?

We Take Request ~ Book of Prayer Intentions



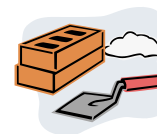

Hatteras Island Food Pantry

Please consider shopping for the food pantry as part of your grocery routine. You may want to purchase items on sale, coupon items, or simply “one extra” of your family’s favorite items.



You may also want to consider giving items that form a meal. For example, spaghetti sauce and noodles, pancake mix and syrup, peanut butter and jelly, casserole ingredients, etc.

Since the size of the families accessing the food pantry can vary from a single person to one of two parents and children, please avoid bulk sized items to ease distribution.

Let us remember no matter how small, our gifts are seen by our Lord. Your donation to our Food Pantry is just one way to consider Lenten almsgiving. Food can be dropped off in the vestibule basket before/after Mass. 24 hour drop box is available on the Social Hall porch.

Items Commonly Needed by the Food Pantry – Standard Sizes Preferred

- Basic foodstuffs – vegetable oil, flour, sugar, coffee, tea, rice, pasta
- Canned meats – CORN beef, chicken, tuna, crabmeat
- Canned vegetables – beets, tomatoes and greens are local favorites
- Cereals – both hot and cold
- Personal care products – toothpaste, toothbrushes, shampoo, soap
- Paper Products – individually wrapped paper towels, toilet paper
- Laundry care and cleaning products
- Pet products

A pesar de que ellos hablaban ante muchas personas, de muchas lenguas y de muchas culturas diferentes, los apóstoles eran entendidos por todos sus oyentes a medida que proclamaban las maravillas que Dios había logrado.

Cómo era esto posible?

Encendidos por el poder del Espíritu Santo, los apóstoles hablaban el lenguaje del corazón. Ellos hablaban con entusiasmo. Ellos hablaban con gratitud. Ellos alababan y daban gracias. Ellos hablaban desde el fondo de su ser. Ellos hablaban desde su alma.

En resumen, ellos hablaban el lenguaje universal- el lenguaje del corazón.

Nosotros somos más humanos- nosotros somos más divinos- cuando hablamos el lenguaje del corazón, cuando hablamos el lenguaje del amor, cuando hablamos y escuchamos con el alma, cuando nuestras palabras tienen origen en la Palabra-Hecha-Hombre.

Como bien sabemos por nuestra propia experiencia, la comunicación implica mucho más de lo que podemos ver a simple vista... o de lo que podemos llegar a escuchar o hablar. Frecuentemente o?ímos, pero fracasamos a la hora de escuchar. Siempre estamos hablando, pero esto no es lo mismo que comunicarnos... o que hablar de corazón a corazón.

San Francisco de Sales nos dice que el Espíritu Santo viene a encender los corazones de los creyentes. Cuando nosotros hablamos y escuchamos con nuestros corazones encendidos por la dicha, la verdad y la gratitud, el conflicto le da paso al entendimiento, la confusión le da paso a la claridad, la distancia le da paso a la intimidad, el dolor le da paso a la sanación, la frustración le da paso al perdón, la violencia le da paso a la paz, el pecado le da paso a la salvación.

Francisco de Sales no ofrece su consejo: “Hablen siempre de Dios como Dios, es decir, con reverencia y devoción, sin ostentar y sin sentirse afectados por nada sino con el espíritu sumiso, lleno de humildad y de caridad. Destilen tanto como puedan de la miel deliciosa de la devoción y de las cosas divinas e imperceptibles dentro de los oídos de una persona y otra. Oren a Dios en su alma para que puedan complacerlo y hacer que su santo rocío y que quede impregnado en lo más profundo de los corazones de aquellos que los escuchen. Es maravilloso como el poder de una propuesta amigable y dulce para hacer buenas obras atrae los corazones de los oyentes”.

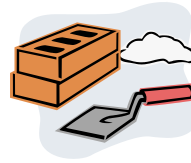
